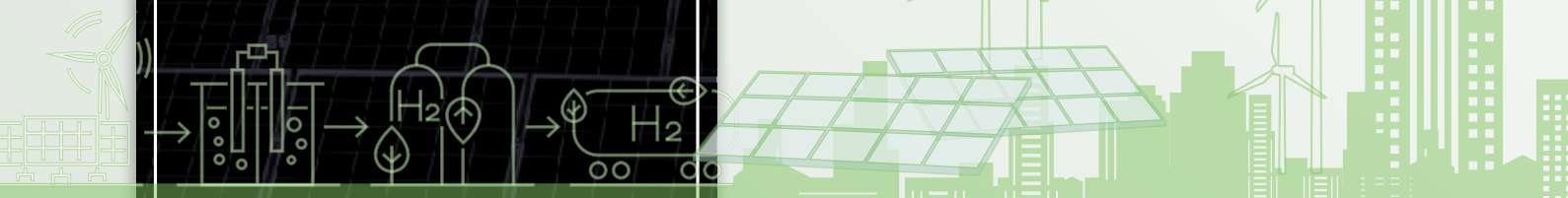
Conference Overview

The purpose of the country's energy transition is to reduce the country's dependence on foreign imports, said Alok Kumar, the Power Secretary. Kumar added that the government is working on combining renewable energy and thermal power under the same PPA.

New Delhi, Jun 16 (PTI) The Electricity (Amendment) Bill, 2021 is likely to be introduced in the monsoon session of Parliament beginning in July. The Bill, inter alia, provides for providing an option to the customers to choose from various electricity service providers like telecom service providers.

Addressing industry body FICCI's 'Indian Energy Transmission' conference, 2022, Power Minister RK Singh said that everyone (all ministries and concerned parties) is in favor of amending the electricity law.

Addressing the India Energy Transmission Summit 2022 organized by FICCI, Union power minister RK Singh on Thursday said that electricity policies, and stakeholders, is one found with the amendments to the Electricity Act.

He informed, "We (power ministry) should be able to take it forward to the Parliament in the monsoon session." The monsoon session is likely to begin in the later part of July 2022.

The bill provides for delicensing of the distribution business to promote competition, the appointment of a member from a non-governmental background in every commission, strengthening of Appellate Tribunal for Electricity (APTEL), and passing rights and duties of consumers.

Singh also announced that there will be a separate Renewable Purchase Obligation (RPO) for wind energy for boosting this clean source.
